Split

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Day 2: Brac

Brac is one of the largest of the central Dalmatian group of islands in the Adriatic Sea and one of the many stunning destinations to visit while enjoying a yacht charter in the Mediterranean. Day 4: Hvar

Hvar sparkles like gold in the sun. This Croatian town is regarded as a high-class seaside attraction and is one of the brightest places in Europe. The environment is a lovely blend of lavender and olive groves, rolling hills, red-roofed towns, and gentle, shaded pine forests, with famous topaz-colored skies shimmering over the azure sea. Day 6: Vis

Vis is located in the north-eastern section of Vis Island, at the bottom of a sheltered harbor. If you enjoy culture, tradition, mystery, and the best Adriatic food, Vis, or Issa (as the ancient Greeks called it), is for you. One of the reasons Vis is regarded as a wonder is that it is a location where time stands still. Vis was founded by the Greeks in 397 B.C., yet it has preserved its old, irresistible Mediterranean appeal and life without worry and trouble to this day.
