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## **Day 1: Marmaris and Turunc Plaji**

In recent years, the port city of Marmaris in Turkey's southwest has grown to be a significant tourist destination. The area is frequently referred to as the "Turquoise Coast" because to the stunning color of its seas all year long.

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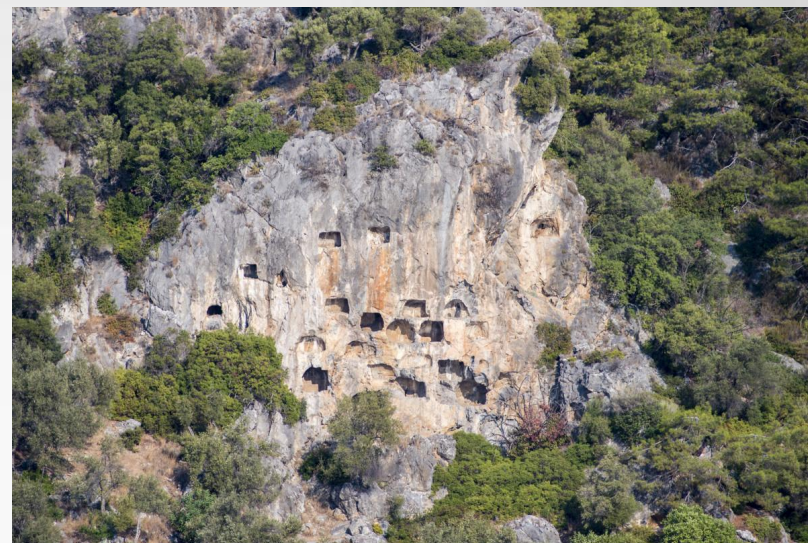
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## Day 2: Tomb Bay

A very particular site is Tomb Bay, Lycian tombs cut into a rock face in the shapes of pigeonholes and temples. To see them up close, step ashore, but wear sturdy footwear.

As you travel south, you'll turn into this stunning, undiscovered bay, which is ideal for paddle boarding and snorkeling. Enjoy the views of the contrasting clear blue waters and sweeping green hills while unwinding before having dinner and drinks on land, spend the afternoon exploring the old rock tombs strewn above the bay. On the western side of the Gulf of Fethiye, close above Tomb Bay, stands the ancient city of Kria.



## Day 3: Fethiye

Setting sail in the morning to the well-liked town of Fethiye, which is well-known for its natural harbor and a number of rock tombs, notably the Amyntas Tomb from the fourth century B.C. Before eating dinner by the water, take a stroll along the promenade that is lined with tavernas or browse the bazaar at night to find a few deals. A vibrant historical town known for its stories, sages, and seers. Fethiye is endowed with a plethora of natural and historical attractions. There are numerous sites to see, as well as mountains and valleys to trek and explore.





## Day 4: Cold Water Bay

The gorgeous bay of Bestas Limani, also known as Cold Water Bay, is only accessible via sea and is a fascinating and must-do experience when traveling across Turkey on a luxury charter.

As you make your way to Cold Water Bay, prepare your cameras because you might encounter dolphins.

The Cold Water Bay, known for its cold water springs that run down into the sea from the Taurus Mountains, promises to leave you feeling refreshed and rejuvenated. Along with the crystal pure blue sea, the bay offers deep water and high cliffs for thrill seekers to rock jump. Even if you don't participate, you can take a dip or try paddle boarding before exploring the ghost town of Kayakoy.

You'll be able to eat a classic dinner while viewing the sunset in the evening.



## Day 5: Kalkan

With the absence of mass tourism, Kalkan remains a charming and unspoiled haven of lush nature, brilliant blue crystal-clear sea, historic architecture, ancient history and warm traditional Turkish hospitality.

Stroll the pristine 12km sandy Patara beach in search of turtles, or hike down the beautiful Saklikent Gorge. While here, visit the UNESCO World Heritage Sites of Letoon and Xanthos before sipping sunset cocktails at one of the wonderful local bars.



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### Day 6: Kapi Creek

After breakfast, cruise to Skopea Limani, one of Turkey's most beautiful sailing spots. Here, there are the greatest places to swim and explore so you can make the most of the turquoise seas. The Creek is renowned within the boat industry for its quiet clear water and picture-perfect scenery. It is located in the Skopia Limani district, tucked behind the southwest region of Fethiye.

Kapi Creek is the ideal site for guests on a yacht to unwind and soak up the Turkish sun, with its lushly vegetated shoreline rich with olive and pine trees and some of the warmest seas in the Mediterranean.

The day can be completed with a traditional Turkish feast and a glass of wine at a magnificent seaside restaurant.



### Day 7: Gocek

Enjoy breakfast and morning swim before heading to Gocek. Along the trip, you will stop at some gorgeous bays for swimming so you can take in the rest of Turkey's splendor.

Gocek is a small yet interesting town. The major shopping street runs parallel to the promenade and is lined with shops that appeal to visitors. Gocek deserves the rest of the time left of this amazing cruise, whether you just want to rest and relax while gazing out at the sea or you need to do some last-minute shopping.
