



NINE DAYS LUXURY YACHT CHARTER CRUISING IN THAILAND & MYANMAR

Day 1

Embark in Phuket towards Phang Nga Bay. Famous for its one hundred or so monolithic limestone karst islets, the area offers breathtaking scenery and is classed as a World Heritage site. Some of the attractions in the itinerary of Phang Nga Bay, would be sea kayaking / paddle boarding amongst the islands, a visit to the traditional stilt fishing village called "Koh Panyi" for fresh seafood lunch. Most islands are uninhabited, offering secluded anchorages under soaring cliffs fringed with jungle, as well as fascinating tender expeditions to hidden beaches, caves and creeks not shown on charts or maps. The famous features of this bay are the hong's - Thai for room. These shallow water fully enclosed lagoons open to the sky. Koh Hong Tunnel - which gives the island its name, is a stunningly beautiful, enclosed pool with a large chimney opening to the sky.







Cruise amongst the many islands of Phang Nga Bay and swim, explore the paradise around you. Anchor at the Six Senses Yao Noi, perched on a verdant hillside. You might decide instead to take the tender to dine ashore at one of the Six Senses renowned restaurants. Each villa has its own pool, but the Ocean Pool villas, which look out from a high hill, are truly spectacular with infinity pools and views all the way across Phang Nga Bay. One of the finest assets of these cruising grounds is that it's equally well - suited to those with a thirst for adventure and those who prefer to relax. The active among the group can dive or even climb a limestone wall.



Day 3

On the third day you will cruise to the Honeymoon Island, idyllic private island off the southeast coast of Phuket. The Mai Thon is the real name, dive site is at a small island and famous for its beautiful coral reefs. The waters are usually crystal clear water with powdery beach and resident wild dolphins that are regularly spotted here. The island is ideal for diving, swimming and sunbathing. Mai Thon offers 6 diving sites in total and has a depth range of 2m to 25m. This means that it's especially suited to expert divers or those who prefer shallow easy dives. For beginners and snorkelers the East side of the island offers the perfect location.



This bay offers one of the best beaches in Phuket with activity but ata quieter pace than Patong, Kata is difficult to beat. Diving and snorkelling around Koh Pu(Crab Island) is good. Ashore is Club Med and many other 5 Star Resorts and an anchorage for cruise ships, live aboard dive boats and superyachts. During the day you will complete immigration and Custom Clearance to exit from Thailand's water heading next day, early morning, to Burma, Surin Island,.



Day 5

The Surin Islands consist out of five islands, Koh Surin Nua, Koh Surin Tai, Koh Ri, Koh Kai and Koh Klang. There is almost no flat ground beyond small pockets of mangroves and little beaches, which nestle in many coves. Guest can go to the beach, swim, snorkel and visit the "Moken" sea gypsy village. The Moken are sea nomads that traditionally lived and travelled the Andaman Sea between Thailand and Burma. In the 1990th they started to settle on Koh Surin permanently. On December 26th 2004, the Moken, as people of the sea, noticed the change in the water and fled up the hill. Unlike other places affected by the Tsunami, no person was harmed, but just like other places the houses were destroyed. In 2005 the two villages have been reconstructed as one in Ao Bon Yai.





Arrive early morning at Kawthaung Port, in the very south of Myanmar. After Immigration formalities, which will take about 1.5 hours you will leave towards Barwell Island located only 20 nautical miles away from Kawthaung Port. Barwell Island will be the first island of the Myeik Archipelago that you will visit: unknown to the outside world, the Myeik Archipelago is located in Myanmar's remote south: a group of 800 deserted islands that lie at the heart of your sailing area.



Day 7

The next day, sail North for about 40 miles to Frost Island: spend the morning relaxing here, explore one of the numerous beaches or go swimming in azure water amongst colourful reef fish, spotting corals, and collecting seashells. Travel few miles Northwest to Rocky Islet for a dive. The group of island in close proximately has endless possibilities. When you will be ready, you will move 15 miles further North to overnight anchorage at southwest Bay of Lampi Island. A beautiful Bay, large beach, offering idyllic overnight anchorage just enjoying the quiet nature's noises going ashore on desert beaches.



Get an early start to cruise to Pulau Bada for a morning visit to a Sea Gypsy (Moken) village. Sea Gypsies are the only human inhabitants of the area. They make their living collecting pearls, shells etc from the sea. You will stop via Cocks Comb island on the way to Dunkin Island. This island is a limestone atoll without a beach, but with a stunning lagoon, shape like a heart. The inlet changes the colour of the ocean and that's why it is also called where is possible to snorkel under the island to the interior. Dunkin Island has been describe as the definition of Paradise, sea is radiant blue with white sand and mostly

untouched. Anchor here for the night.



Day 9

Have a leisurely cruise during the day back to Kawthaung port stopping for lunch on-route for a swim, snorkel and beach excursion. Once back in Kawthaung, Customs and Immigration outbound clearance to be completed. Heading back in Thailand you should stop by Ko Ra - Ko Phra Thong Archipelago. The site consists of two islands in the Andaman Sea, 2 km off the west coast of Southern Thailand. About 1,064 people, most of them fishermen; inhabit the area, which features a rare and complex habitat mosaic including grasslands, peat swamp forests, freshwater pools, evergreen forests, mangrove forests, extensive seagrass beds and coral reefs.

Disembarkation the following day in Phuket.
